Minimum System Requirements

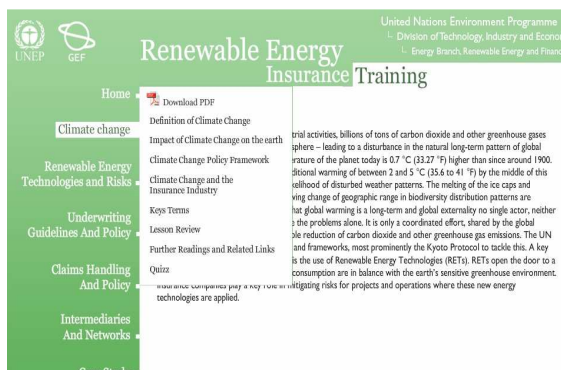
- Windows versions, Pentium, Mac OS or UNIX, etc
